The Source of Wisdom

- The <u>Fear</u> of the Lord (Job 28:28; Prov. 1:7)
- The <u>Knowledge</u> of God (Prov. 9:10)
 - Knowledge of God's <u>Power</u> (Psa. 33:8)
 - Knowledge of God's Holiness (Rev. 15:4)
 - Knowledge of God's Love

(I Sam. 12:22–24; Psa. 34)

What the Fear of the Lord Is

- It includes <u>love</u>
- It includes <u>reverence</u>
- It includes <u>submission</u>

What the Fear of the Lord Is (cont.)

 Summary: The fear of the Lord is an <u>affectionate reverence</u> for God by which the child of God <u>bends</u> himself <u>humbly</u> and <u>carefully</u> to his Father's <u>will</u>

The Attitude of Fearing God

- Only one dread—to <u>offend</u> the Lord
- Only one desire—to please the Lord

The Importance of Fearing God

- Isaiah 11:23—<u>Christ feared the</u> <u>Lord</u>
- Jeremiah 2:19—<u>It is a sin not to</u> <u>fear the Lord</u>
- Ecclesiastes 12:13—<u>Fearing God</u> is the whole duty of man

The Importance of Fearing God (cont.)

- 2 Samuel 23:3-4—<u>The fear of</u> <u>God is essential to true Christian</u> <u>leadership</u>
- Psalm 147:11—<u>The fear of God is</u> <u>a distinguishing mark of those</u> <u>who fear Him</u>

How We Learn the Fear of the Lord

- Studying God's Word
 - Proverbs 2:1–5
- Beholding God's <u>majesty</u>

– Psalm 96:1–9

How We Learn the Fear of the Lord (cont.)

- Seeing God's works
 - In His creation (Psa. 33:6–9)
 - In <u>history</u> (Josh. 4:20–24)
 - In <u>our lives</u> (I Sam. 12:24)

"Remember: it's not so much that we think about the wrong things; it is that we do not think about the right things!"

- Evolution
- Amorality
- <u>Autonomous</u> Man
- Socialistic, One-World Order

Conclusion
