

What Is Salvation?

To save literally means "to rescue or set free."

Why Does God Offer Salvation?

- God cares about our <u>need</u>
 - <u>Prisoners</u> of sin
 - Guilty and condemned
 - Sick, <u>blind</u>, and weak

Why Does God Offer Salvation?

- God cares about His glory
 - Christ's incarnation
 - Christ's <u>death</u> on the cross
 - A demonstration of God's love
 - A demonstration of God's grace
 - Christ's <u>resurrection</u>

How Does God Provide Salvation?

- A <u>Deliverer</u> for the prisoners of sin (Heb. 2:14–15)
- A <u>Substitute</u> for the condemned (1 Pet. 2:24)

How Does God Provide Salvation?

- A <u>Healer</u> for the sick (Luke 4:18–21)
- Our response: <u>believe</u> (Acts 16:31)

What Are the Results of Salvation?

- <u>Freedom</u> instead of imprisonment
 - Freedom from sin's penalty
 - Freedom from sin's power
 - Freedom from sin's dominion

What Are the Results of Salvation?

- <u>Power</u> instead of weakness
 - Power to live righteously
 - Power to resist the temptation to sin
 - Power to not fear death





The Necessity of Salvation

- God is <u>holy</u>, but people are <u>sinners</u>
- God lives in <u>heaven</u>, but sinners must go to <u>hell</u>
- God <u>loves</u> people, but people naturally <u>hate</u> God

• <u>Regeneration</u> (John 3:3)— "rebirth"

- <u>Redemption</u> (1 Pet. 1:18–19)— "to buy or regain something"
 - The price of redemption: Christ's death
 - The result of redemption: no longer slaves to sin

- <u>Remission</u> (Heb. 9:22)—
 "a reduction; a cancellation of a debt"
- Justification (Acts 13:38–39)—"a declaration of righteousness"

- The forgiveness of sin
- The imputation of righteousness
 - Impute means "to credit something to a person"

 <u>Reconciliation</u> (2 Cor. 5:18)—
 "restoration to friendship or harmony"





- The <u>present</u> condition of humanity
 - The unsaved
 - No joy or understanding
 - <u>Corrupt</u> and contaminated

- The <u>present</u> condition of humanity
 - The saved
 - Joyful
 - Understand <u>spiritual</u> things
 - <u>Pure</u>

- The <u>eternal</u> condition of humanity
 - The unsaved spend eternity in <u>torment</u> (Mark 9:46)
 - Eternally
 - Physically

Luke 16:19–31 The man in hell has . . . eyes; ears; a tongue; a mind; pain

 The saved spend eternity in <u>heaven</u> (John 14:2)

- Wrong answers
 - Be <u>baptized</u>
 - Join the church
 - Do good deeds
 - <u>Clean up</u> your life

- The right answer
 - <u>Believe</u> (Acts 16:31)—"to confidently trust"

- About Jesus
 - Lord—Christ is our <u>Master</u>
 - Jesus-means "Jehovah saves"
 - Christ—means "<u>Anointed</u> One"
 - Jesus rose again (1 Cor. 15:17-22)

About myself

I am a sinner (Rom. 5:18)
I can live because Jesus died and rose again (Rom. 5:20-21)
